We are excited to be sending our first ever newsletter to our supporters and friends! It has been quite a year for Family Service of Napa Valley. We began 2014 with our most successful annual fundraising event at Mondavi Winery raising \$38,000. We were then surprised and humbled to win Outstanding Non Profit of the Year by Mechanics Bank and the Napa Chamber of Commerce in May.

On July 1st we launched our newest program. The Community Connection Network is a partnership with the Progress Foundation serving residents who are in an emerging crisis and could use some help getting connected to available resources in the community. It is an exciting partnership because it gives Napa County an alternative to sending residents to the Emergency Room or calling the Police as the only option when they are entering an emerging crisis.

We kicked off a branding project this summer to elevate our presence in the community and better educate on all that we are in the Napa Valley.

Led by one of our newest board members
Sarah Moore, a Senior Strategist at Mission
Minded in San Francisco, the board and staff
have worked together to collaborate and
brainstorm on the branding of Family Service.

Community Connection Network Launched

Using Community Dollars More Efficiently

In late summer, Family Service and Progress Foundation launched a new partnership to provide a mid step for the community who are in need of immediate assistance; including mental health support and linkage to available services to stabilize individuals.

Prior to this partnership, people in need would immediately escalate to needing higher levels of care such as crisis and emergency room services. Some examples of when the Network should be contacted include; residents who are at risk of losing housing, substance abuse issues, needing support, referral to appropriate agencies, services to outpatient therapy and support addressing basic needs, i.e. food, clothing, shelter, child care.

This partnership will help alleviate over usage of emergency rooms and the police when intervention and linkage to existing services are the solution to help. We will be providing more information in the next newsletter on how the Network has helped to date.

Art Created from Rubble

On August 24th nearly every citizen of Napa lost something significant to them, whether it was their sense of security or personal property. Family Service was among numerous downtown businesses and agencies to lose use of its building.



In an effort to raise money to help rebuild and to also further its mission of helping the community heal, FSNV is pleased to announce the launch of Napa*Rocks*-art created from rubble. "Art is an effective tool in healing from trauma. It helps people communicate their stresses, fears and process anxiety." (Marti Palmer, Clinical Director at Family Service)

Napa*Rocks* officially launched on September 2, 2014 at New Technology High. Freshmen students were asked to create art using items collected from around town-including historic brick, rock, ceramic, rebar, and pieces of glass, along with any personal items they may want to commemorate. FSNV reached out specifically to New Tech High because of its emphasis on project based learning with authentic community involvement. We have expanded to other schools, including Harvest Middle School as well as artists in the community. FSNV is in the process of activating the website, Napa-Rocks.com.

Robin Williams Tribute

Suicide Prevention

On Wednesday 9/17/14, Family Service in partnership with City Winery hosted a tribute to Robin William's life and a "Call to Action" to reduce the prevalence of suicides during Suicide Prevention Month in September. Ticket proceeds were donated to Family Service to help with our earthquake relief costs. With a showing of Dead Poets



Society and open conversations about how suicide has affected individuals lives, we came together to show one another that we are here for each other in the most difficult of situations. With ticket sales and a portion of food/beverage purchases that evening, \$2500 was raised that goes directly to help cover the \$100,000 costs incurred from the earthquake.
