### **Greetings!**

Mentis: Napa's Center for Mental Health Services announced today it raised \$100,000 at their 5th Annual World of Wine fundraiser held at Opus One Winery on March 12th, 2016. The proceeds will be used to support expansion and growth for the agency. They provide bi-lingual professional mental health services to people of every age, stage and income level, and specialize in trauma informed care.

Mentis' Trauma Program is a strength-based framework that is grounded in an understanding and responsiveness to the impact of trauma for the residents of the community. From intake through discharge, they provide a safe environment to meet the unique needs of survivors and avoid inadvertent re-traumatization. This model of service is designed to meet the mental health needs of people along the continuum of trauma and stressor related disorders.

"I am so proud of the work that Mentis has done to increase their accessibility in our community," said Board Member Christopher Barefoot and creator of World of Wine. "By working with so many other non-profits, they have extended their reach throughout Napa County. When we started the fundraiser 5 years ago, we were so pleased to raise almost \$25,000 and this year's \$100,000-total demonstrates growing community support and ensures the breadth of services that are so badly needed."

To date, the World of Wine fundraiser has raised more than \$250,000 to support the delivery of mental health services to Napa County residents..

"For 65 years, as the oldest nonprofit in Napa County, we have continuously delivered mental health services to residents in the community through our clinic, our local partners, in the schools and in the hospitals," said Rob Weiss, executive director of Mentis. "The success of our annual fundraiser ensures we can continue this effort on behalf of the community."

For over 65 years, Mentis: Napa's Center for Mental Health Services (formerly Family Service of Napa Valley) has been dedicated to the emotional health and wellness of our community through accessible and affordable mental health services.
